The Pacific Orthopaedic Asia Association (APOA) - Depuy Spine Clinical Fellowship 2013 took place from 10th November to 30th November 2013. Landed in Sapporo on the first snowing day 11th November and my fellowship began on the afternoon by assistant of Pf Abumi's Surgery for a patient who has cervical myelopathy caused by OPLL with cervical kyphosis. Pf Abumi allowed me to put the cervical pedicle screw which was my first time to do in live surgery. The day ended by having dinner with Pf and he took me and another Japanese traditional doctor to Japanese restaurant.

On Tuesday, I visited the Hokkaido University Hospital and I had a chance to observe 2 cases of cervical surgery. The first case was Schawnoma Tumor at C5-6 and the second case was cervical myelopathy caused by OPLL.

Wednesday (13 Nov 2013) was a date with Dr Satoh at Eniwa Hospital, Eniwa. Eniwa is a city in Ishikari Subprefecture, Hokkaido, Japan. It is on the Ishikari plain, 8 km north of Chitose and 26 km south of the prefectural capital Sapporo. It was first time for me to travel by rapid airport train. Four cases were lined up for the day. I also got an opportunity to scrub up.

Thursday (14 Nov 2013) began at 7.30 in the morning with research updates at the University Hospital. It was followed by Operation theatre where huge limpoma tumor from T9 to L1 was lined up. I backed to Eniwa Hospital to observe 2 operations with lumbar spine degenerative diseases on Friday (15 Nov 2013).

On Monday (18 Nov 2013) a case of Lumbar decompression, instrumentation and fusion was lined up at Eniwa Hospital and I also had a chance to observe the cervical midline splitting laminoplasy for C2-C7 OPLL.

I observed a surgery for a case of L1-2 OPLL at University Hospital on Tuesday (19 Nov 2013). This patient had an wrong level decompression of previous surgery at other hospital.

On Wednesday (20 Nov 2013) was a date with Dr Suda at Spinal Cord Injury Center, Bibai. Bibai is a neighboring city, approximately 60 km north-east of Sapporo, which is well connected by intercity trains. Spinal

Cord Injury Centre at Bibai is the only tertiary care centre for spinal trauma in the island of Hokkaido. Five cases were lined up for the day, also got an opportunity to scrub up in two of them. Session in the Operating Room was followed by conference where post-op X- rays of the operated cases were critically analyzed and the cases posted for the next operation theatre were discussed at length. The day concluded with traditional Japanese dining. At the end of the day, I was thoroughly impressed by the young & enthusiastic team of doctors at Spinal cord Injury Centre and the dynamic personality of Dr Suda.



Thursday (21 Feb 2013) began at 7.30 in the morning with research updates

at the University Hospital. I again met Pf Abumi at Operative Theater of Sapporo Orthopaedic Hospital and I had an opportunity to assist Pf Abumi to perform a salvage operation with L3-4, L4-5 TLIF.

Next day, 20 Feb 2013, I again travelled to Bibai where Dr Suda and team greeted me with three cases. It was very interesting to learn about S (Suda) point and hybrid construct (Cervical Pedicle screw with Lateral mass fixation) commonly used by Dr Suda.

Last week of my stay in Sapporo, I came to Sapporo Orthopadic Hospital to see Pf Abumi and assisted him to do an operation with long fusion from L1 to S1 on Monday (25 Nov 2013). It

also was first time for me to see the Sacro-iliac screw fixation which was done by Pf Abumi. I was at University Hospital on Tuesday (26 Nov 2013) to observe a surgery for the AIS patient with double rod rotation technique was done by Pf Ito.

On Wednesday (27 Nov 2013), I again came to Bibai to meet Dr Suda and his team with 3 operative cases. On Thursday (28 Nove 2013), it was a day with heavy snowing, I travelled to Eniwa and observed 3 operative cases with lumbar degenerative disorder. In the evening of this day, Pf Abumi took me to a Chinese restaurant to have farewell dinner with him. I again visited the Eniwa hospital to see the operations and say goodbye to Dr Satoh and his team.

My three weeks of stay in Sapporo was extremely satisfying. I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to Prof Abumi for having organized such an academically enriched program. Here I would also mention other consultants from the affiliated hospitals who took

extra efforts to teach me and share their skills, technique and experience. I also would like to thank Pf Vo Van Thanh for his recommendation and I would not have this chance without his help.

Finally I would thank the APOA Spine section especially the Chairman; Vice Chairman; Secretary for selecting me for this fellowship and providing with the golden opportunity. A final word of appreciation for Ms Helen Chong and Kong for co-ordinating the fellowship program.
